

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sabot A, B, C and Seashell

2007 SEMANA NAUTICA REGATTA

HOSTED BY SANTA BARBARA YACHT CLUB

JUNE 23-24, 2007

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the 2005-2008 Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of US Sailing, the rules of the relevant classes, and the Notice of Race, except as modified by these Sailing Instructions. All competitors shall be members in good standing with their respective Class.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official regatta board located on the Sabot Condos near the launch ramp.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions made ashore will be posted at the regatta board before 1030 hours on Saturday, and before 1030 on Sunday, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 hours on the day before it will take effect.

3.2 Any change to the sailing instructions made on the water will be hailed to each competing yacht.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Friday, June 22, 2007

1600-1800 Early Registration at SBYC

830-1030 Registration at the Launch Ramp

1030 Skippers Meeting at the Launch Ramp

1200 First Warning

Five races scheduled for all fleets

1700 Social at SBYC

Sunday, June 24, 2007

1030 Report Time

1200 First Warning

Four races scheduled for all fleets

1530 No starts after this time

5. RACING AREA

Saturday and Sunday: the racing area will be inside Santa Barbara Harbor for the C and Seashell fleets, and outside the harbor for A and B. Any fleet may be moved inside the harbor at the race discretion of the race committee.

6. THE COURSE

A and B courses are described in the attached "Sabot Course". Courses for C and Seashells will be described at the skippers meeting.

7. MARKS

Marks for the A and B course will be small yellow tetrahedrons (triangles).
Marks for the inside course will be orange balls.

8. THE START

8.1 Races will be started using Appendix Q- Sound-Signal Starting System. The class to be started and the course will be hailed prior to commencement of the starting sequence.

8.2 The starting line will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and a small yellow tetrahedron at the pin end. The start/finish lines shall be restricted for all boats not starting or finishing.

8.3 Starting and Finishing on the inside course will be described at the skippers' meeting.

9. THE FINISH

The finish will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and a small yellow tetrahedron at the pin end.

10. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

Protest forms are available from the Race Committee. The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the race committee boat returns to the dock. The same protest time limit applies to all protests by the race committee and to requests for redress.

11. SCORING

The low point scoring system of Appendix A will apply except that all races will be counted.

12. SAFETY

12.1 Competitors shall wear UCSG approved Type III Personal Flotation Devices at all times while on the water.

12.2 The Race Committee may instruct a competitor to return to shore at any time. Boats failing to respond to this instruction may be disqualified from one or more

aces.

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Participants in this event compete entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
