AMENDMENTS TO THE
NOR & SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Organizing Authority for the 2020 Club Handicap Racing Fleet (CHRF) Summer Series will be:
The Santa Barbara Yacht Club (SBYC), 130 Harbor Way, Santa Barbara, CA 93109

Sailing Instruction 2.2 (b) is deleted and replaced with:

2 ENTRY AND ELIGIBILITY

b.) RACE DAY ENTRY: Eligible boats shall be entered in a race when the Skipper or crew member of the boat signs the boat in with the Race Committee (RC) [via the online form](#) on the day of the race and lists the name of the Skipper and the name of the SBYC member onboard for the race, if the skipper is not a member of SBYC.

Sailing Instruction 5 is deleted and replaced with:

5 MANDATORY SIGN-IN

Boats must sign in with via an online form available at <https://sbyc.org/racing> or [via the online form](#). Boats failing to do so may not be scored. Note that it is not acceptable to sign in by radio.

Sailing Instruction 22 is deleted and replaced with:

22 PRIZES

22.1 Race day trophies will be awarded and available for pickup at SBYC.

22.2 This race shall not count towards the Annual CHRF High Point Trophy but shall count towards the CHRF Summer Series.

Sailing Instruction 24 is deleted and replaced with:

24 CREW / REPLACEMENT OF CREW

24.1 Crew taking the place of the boat owner at the helm of a boat for longer than a brief period of time, shall be listed on the boat entry form, by the boat owner (either online or paper entry form) as an Authorized Skipper. There must still be a SBYC member on board at all times as stated in rule 2.4. The CHRF committee may choose to not score or disqualify boats that are found to have broken this rule without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1.

24.2 Crew size includes all people on a boat and shall meet the following requirements:

- A. 25 feet and less = no more than 3 people
- B. 25.1-30 feet = no more than 4 people
- C. 30.1-35 feet = no more than 5 people
- D. 35.1-40 feet = no more than 6 people
- E. 40.1-45 feet = no more than 7 people
- F. 45.1-50 feet = no more than 8 people

G. 50.1-55 feet = no more than 9 people

H. 55.1-60 feet = no more than 10 people

I. 60.1-65 feet = no more than 11 people

J. 65.1-70 feet = no more than 12 people

Children from the same household of a crewmember on that boat, under the age of eight as of the date of the race day, and not actively crewing or helping the performance of the boat (including hiking) shall not count towards the crew size.

- 24.3 All crew are required to have face covering for nose and mouth (such as a face mask, buff, or neck gaiter). It is highly recommended that they be worn at all times and in particular, while in the harbor at the dock and on the water when working in confined areas less than six feet distance from other crew members.
- 24.4 It is recommended that all crew wear closed-finger gloves.
- 24.5 It is recommended that crew be comprised of co-habitants and/or close contacts (also known as your "Quaran-team").
- 24.6 It is highly recommended that each crew comply to the best of their ability with CDC covid-19 social distancing and safety recommendations (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html>).
