2020 Wet Wednesday Series AMENDMENTS TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Organizing Authority for the 2020 Wet Wednesday (WW) Series will be: The Santa Barbara Yacht Club (SBYC), 130 Harbor Way, Santa Barbara, CA 93109

These amendments replace all previous amendments.

Sailing Instruction 8 is deleted and replaced with:

8. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- Wet Wednesday races will run June 17 through October 14. Races will not count towards any overall Wet Wednesday Series scoring and will be scored as individual races independent of one another through July 29. Races will count for season and series points starting on August 5, 2020.
 2020 WW Fall Series: August 5 through September 23
- 8.2 There will be Wet Wednesday 'Fun' Races on the following dates:
 September 30, October 7 and October 14. These races will not count towards any overall Wet
 Wednesday Series scoring and will be scored as individual races independent of one another.

Sailing Instruction 10 is deleted and replaced with:

10. SPINNAKERS

Non-spinnaker rating adjustments will be given to boats that request the rating change at least one hour in advance of their scheduled start for that race day.

Sailing Instruction 22 is deleted and replaced with:

22. SCORING

- 22.1 The low-point scoring system of Appendix A will apply for the 2020 WW Fall Series. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 22.2 For the Wet Wednesday Class perpetual trophies, Appendix A will apply except that a boat's series score shall be the sum of all individual scores in the Fall segment. WW Fun Races scores shall not be used. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 22.3 Race Committee duty will be scored as a first place if the race for R/C boat's class is completed, except, if the R/C boat races, the boat's score for that race will be used. Race committee duty will count only once during the series.
- 22.4 Boats that register for a segment but fail to compete shall be excluded from that segment's scoring.
- 22.5 The number of boats to compete in each segment shall be counted independently of the other segments.
- 22.6 Boats that compete in more than one fleet shall be scored as a separate boat in each fleet and shall receive a 'DNC' in each race missed.
- 22.7 If a race is not raced for any reason or a race is abandoned for a class, no boat in that class will receive a score (including no DNC's) for that race per RRS 90.3.

Sailing Instruction 26 is deleted and replaced with:

26 CREW

- 26.1 Crew size includes all people on a boat and shall meet the following requirements:
 - A. 25 feet and less = no more than 3 people
 - B. 25.1-30 feet = no more than 4 people

- C. 30.1-35 feet = no more than 5 people
- D. 35.1-40 feet = no more than 6 people
- E. 40.1-45 feet = no more than 7 people
- F. 45.1-50 feet = no more than 8 people
- G. 50.1-55 feet = no more than 9 people
- H. 55.1-60 feet = no more than 10 people
- I. 60.1-65 feet = no more than 11 people
- J. 65.1-70 feet = no more than 12 people

Children from the same household of a crewmember on that boat, under the age of eight as of the date of the race day, and not actively crewing or helping the performance of the boat (including hiking) shall not count towards the crew size.

- 26.2 All crew are required to have face covering for nose and mouth (such as a face mask, buff, or neck gaiter). It is highly recommended that they be worn at all times and in particular, while in the harbor at the dock and on the water when working in confined areas less than six feet distance from other crew members.
- It is recommended that all crew wear closed-finger gloves. 26.3
- 26.4 It is recommended that crews be comprised of co-habitants and/or close contacts (also known as your "Quaran-team").
- 26.5 It is highly recommended that each crew comply to the best of their ability with CDC covid-19 social distancing and safety recommendations (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/preventgetting-sick/prevention.html).
