The Organizing Authority for the 2020 Holiday Regatta will be: The Santa Barbara Yacht Club (SBYC), 130 Harbor Way, Santa Barbara, CA 93109

Sailing Instrucion 4 is deleted and replaced with:

4. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors and amendments to these Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official notice board located on the lower deck of SBYC. These notices will also be posted on the event page at https://sbyc.org/challenge-cup.

Sailing Instruction 7 is deleted and replaced with:

7. SCHEDULE

7.1 Friday, December 4

2000 Competitor briefing will be sent out via a video prior to this time.

Saturday, December 5

1000	Registration closes

- 1015 Class breaks, class flags, and order of starts will be posted by this time
- 1200 Warning signal for first race
- 1540 No warning signal after this time

7.2 Sunday, December 6

- 1200 Warning signal for first race
- 1530 No warning signal after this time
- After Racing Virtual Awards. Awards can be picked up at the front desk of SBYC at your convenience.
- 7.3 Number of Races: Six (6) races are scheduled for all classes, with no more than three (3) races to be sailed on any one day.

Sailing Instruction 8 is deleted and replaced with:

8. CLASS FLAGS & CLASS DESIGNATIONS

Rating Breaks and class flags will be posted on the notice board and online at <u>https://sbyc.org/challenge-</u> <u>cup</u> by 1015 on the first day of racing.

Sailing Instruction 9 is deleted and replaced with:

9. RACING AREA

The racing area will be within two miles of SBYC.

Sailing Instruction 16.1 is deleted and replaced with:

16. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

16.1 Protest forms are available online at <u>https://forms.gle/MGrK9Gafk2QRwBtu6</u>. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.

Sailing Instruction 21 is added:

- 21. **CREW**
- 21.1 Crew size includes all people on a boat and shall meet the following requirements:
 - A. 25 feet and less = no more than 3 people
 - B. 25.1-30 feet = no more than 4 people
 - C. 30.1-35 feet = no more than 5 people
 - D. 35.1-39.9 feet = no more than 6 people
 - E. 40.0-45 feet = no more than 7 people
 - F. 45.1-50 feet = no more than 8 people
 - G. 50.1-55 feet = no more than 9 people
 - H. 55.1-60 feet = no more than 10 people
 - I. 60.1-65 feet = no more than 11 people
 - J. 65.1-70 feet = no more than 12 people
- 21.2 All crew are required to have face covering for nose and mouth (such as a face mask, buff, or neck gaiter). It is highly recommended that they be worn at all times and in particular, while in the harbor at the dock and on the water when working in confined areas less than six feet distance from other crew members.
- 21.3 It is recommended that all crew wear closed-finger gloves.
- 21.4 It is recommended that crews be comprised of co-habitants and/or close contacts (also known as your "Quaran-team").
- 21.5 It is highly recommended that each crew comply to the best of their ability with CDC covid-19 social distancing and safety recommendations (<u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html</u>).
