June was born in Compton, California, and spent her formative years in the Sherman Oaks and Westwood areas. She attended the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). June married Richard DeVoto, and together they traveled extensively throughout Europe and the Middle East, living for a time in Tripoli and Libya.

In 1972, June and her second husband, Robert (Bob) Lukus, relocated to Santa Barbara. Two years later, in 1974, they joined the Santa Barbara Yacht Club. After her marriage to Bob Lukus ended, June became a member of the Club in her own right, making history as the first single female Flag Member. Her uncle, Dr. Dan Hills, was also an active member of the Santa Barbara Yacht Club.

June was a dedicated and active member of the Santa Barbara Yacht Club from 1974 until her passing in 2022. During her many years of involvement, she was recognized for her exceptional contributions. In 1986, she received the SBYC Clarence Hills Memorial Award for Outstanding Person of the Year. Later, in 1997, she was honored with the SBYCW Lee McFarland Woman of the Year Award.

June played an important role in preserving the history of the Santa Barbara Yacht Club. She took responsibility for organizing and recording historical documents, and she was instrumental in creating the Trophy and Deeds manuals. Additionally, she compiled three leather binders containing notes, photographs, and newspaper clippings that covered approximately 50 years of the Club's history.

June remained an active and devoted member of the Santa Barbara Yacht Club until her death in 2022, leaving behind a legacy of commitment and service to the Club and its history.
